





The Women Development Cell (WDC) of SIWS College conducted the following activities in the year 2019-2020.

1) A talk on "Domestic Violence" by Advocate Shalini Devi on 13th September 2019:

Violence against women is a serious problem in India. It was the need of the hour to educate young minds of our college so that they are aware of the various rights given to them through our Indian laws.

The session started with an interactive talk about the basics of domestic violence and later on, various rights and privileges were enlightened. Students and teachers equally participated in this session. Emphasis was also given on different legal rights of both men and women. It was an enlightening session for both, students and teachers. More than 80 students attended the seminar.

2) A Workshop on "Stress Management and Mental Health" by Dr. Sherlyn Senthinathan on 10th December, 2019

Stress levels seem to be high in India compared to other countries, both developed and emerging, says a survey. Nearly 75% of respondents here do not feel comfortable talking to a medical professional about their stress and cite cost as one of the barriers. Work and finances are the key reasons people attribute their stress to. It is the need of the hour to make young minds aware about mental health and ways to tackle it.

The session started with an interactive talk about stress and its causes. Emphasis was also given about mental health awareness. There was an enthusiastic participation by students and teachers in this enlightening session.

More than 122 students, both boys and girls, attended the session.



The session started with an interactive talk on the difference between Constitutional and Legal Rights. Students and teachers equally participated in this session. Emphasis was given on different Legal Rights of Women regarding domestic violence, sexual harassment, rape, molestation, role of police and authorities and succession rights of property. It was an enlightening session for students and the teachers.

2) Workshop on Pre-Marital Counseling by Mrs. Pradnaya Saraf, Mrs. Savita Kurade, Mrs. Sangeeta Saraf, and Mr. Chandrakant Sarvgod of Stree Mukti Sanghtana on 10th and 11th September,2018.

The counseling sessions provided students, information about the necessary skills requirement to enhance communication, problem solving, and decrease conflict by addressing expectations within marriage.

A session on Sexuality Education cleared myths about sex. Premarital counseling programs have emerged as a way to lower the chances of divorce and also to understand expectations after marriage. Students actively participated in these sessions. Their doubts were answered and many misconceptions cleared. It was an eye-opening session for both the students and teachers. More than hundred students attended the two day session.



> Report of Activities:
