3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

The college is responsive to community needs and intrinsically intertwined with the national fabric. Concentrated efforts are made to provide expanded opportunities to the students to participate in community development programmes.

- N.S.S. unit of the college provides Blood Donors Cards to needy persons which enable them to obtain a blood bottle (350 ml.) per card free of cost. Every year about 40-50 cards are used by college teaching/non-teaching staff and outsiders.
- Blood donation drive was organized on 5th August, 2014 in which **158 blood bottles** were collected, besides conducting the Thalassemia test. Again on 5th December, 2014, a second blood donation drive was organized in which **126 blood bottles** were procured, thus making a remarkable contribution of **284 blood bottles** in total in the academic year 2014-15.

- On 6th December, 2014 sweets and books were distributed amongst the poor children from slums around Wadala Bridge.
- On 30-31st December, 2014, visits to an old age and blind home at Goregaon were organised.
