## **Transparency in Administrative and Auxiliary Functions**

The college is a Tamil Minority Institution affiliated to the University of Mumbai. It is governed by South Indians' Welfare Society (Registered under Schedule VII [Vide Rule 17(I)], Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860, Registration No. 1036, The Bombay Public Trust Act, Bom XXIX, 1950, Registration No. F213 (B)

The institute has a two tier system of governance. At the society level, there is a Board of Trustees comprising of Chairman, Vice Chairman, General Secretary, Joint Secretary, Treasurer and other members. The Management is the apex authority responsible for all decisions. The management's purview is both academic as well as administrative. Some of the crucial areas handled by management are:

- Recruitment
- Financial Decisions
- Infrastructure Decisions
- Policy matters
- Matters related to UGC, Government of Maharashtra and the University of Mumbai
- Perspective Plans

The members of management meet to check progress of the college and discuss and deliberate upon the institutional requirements and unanimously take crucial decisions for the betterment of organization.

The statutory decision making bodies in the college are College Development Committee (CDC) and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The members make plans for the college regarding academic, administrative and infrastructural matters and enable the college to maintain holistic development. Specific recommendations regarding certain issues and needs are discussed with the management.

- ↗ The CDC prepares the overall comprehensive development plan of the college regarding academic, administrative and infrastructural growth and initiates it for progress of the college.
- ↗ The primary task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of the college. It channelizes all efforts and measures of the institution towards promoting its holistic academic excellence.

## **Financial Transparency**

The institution has very strong internal control system in respect of financial transactions. Each and every financial transaction is carried out under the supervision of head of the institution. Receipts are given for each and every transaction irrespective of volume of transaction. Similarly every voucher is supported by valid document wherever applicable.


The chief source of revenues for the organization is Grants-in-aid from the government, admission fees and examination fees collected from the students. The allocated funds are used for Students' welfare & development and also for organizational, infrastructural and technical development. Deficits are taken care of by the management.

The funds received are utilized for the holistic development of students. It is ensured by year round conduct of academic events, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The institute plans a budget well in advance, which is approved by the management.

All the financial transactions and related statements and books of accounts are duly audited at the end of every financial year by an external auditor. If additional expenses surpass the budget proposals, the governing body takes special measures.

In order to ensure financial transparency, the following system, practices and procedures have been put in place:

1. As per the requirements of the University of Mumbai, there is a purchase committee in the college headed by the Principal and includes management representatives, Vice Principals and the heads of all the Science departments.
2. Admission process has been computerized and is in online mode.
3. The statement of income and expenditure are presented before the Governing body for approval.
