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#### ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2018 - 19

S.I.W.S. College has always strived to reach new heights in terms of quality teaching, academics, infrastructure and focused on co-curricular and extracurricular activities for the all-round development of student's personality. Besides rigorous academic programs, we seek to develop and nurture the different facets of the students' personality by providing holistic grooming with the philosophy 'Vidya Dhanam Sarva Dhanat Pradhanam'

Our Academic performance for the year 2017-18 has been good with the Final Year results of the aided courses averaging out to be 75% and above 80% in the unaided section.

#### I. Academic activities:

The college has always focussed on the betterment of academics. Teachers have been undergoing training for enhancement of quality in the delivery of lectures.

- a) The Department of Business Economics took a lead to organize a one day workshop in collaboration with the Board of Studies in Business Economics, University of Mumbai for T.Y.B.Com. on Friday, July 20, 2018. This was followed by One Day Workshop of Revised T.Y.B.M.S. syllabus on 21st July 2018.
- b) The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (I.Q.A.C.) led by Principal Dr. Usha Iyer and IQAC co-ordinator and Vice Principal CA Vaibhav Banjan, take all efforts to improve the quality of education and achieve better standards. I.Q.A.C. in collaboration with Income Tax Department, Mumbai, organised a Seminar on Communication Strategy of Direct and Indirect Taxes on 8<sup>th</sup> August 2018 for the third year students.

- c) The Department of Business Law conducted a workshop on "Digital Agreement & Cyber Crime" on 28<sup>th</sup> July, 2018. The session was conducted by Adv. Akash Thate, Legal Counsel for Yashwantrao Chavan Legal Aid Group (Navbharat Yuva Andolan Mumbai) Mantralaya and a trainer for Special Police Officers. The department also conducted a one day seminar in association with Consumer Guidance Society on 'Consumer Rights Awareness & Financial Literacy' on 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2019. All the students who attended the seminar were given participation certificates sponsored by the National Stock Exchange (NSE).
- d) The **Department of Mathematics** organized One Day **Workshop** on "**TALLY 7.2**" for T.Y.B.Com. students on Saturday, **18**<sup>th</sup> **August 2018**. The students were given hands on experience of the software.
- e) The **Department of Business Communication** conducted a week-long workshop on **English literary skills from 27<sup>th</sup> July 2018 to 4<sup>th</sup> August 2018**. Interactive sessions conducted by eminent resource persons from industries and business helped students to build their confidence in dealing with stage fear.
- f) The **Department of Chemistry** organized an **intercollegiate competition 'Rasashastra 2018' on 21<sup>st</sup> September 2018**. It attracted 47 participants from various colleges affiliated to University of Mumbai. The events were related to recent trends in chemistry.
- g) The **Department of Microbiology** organized an **inter-collegiate fest 'MICROBIA' on** 12<sup>th</sup> **January 2019.** The competitions like flash card making, microbial ad-mad show and Bio-Jig saw hunt etc., were organized.
- h) The **Department of Environmental Studies** organized a talk on the topic 'Climate friendly nutritious food to fight against climate change'. The talk was delivered by **Ms. Sangeeta Kharat of Srushtidnyan an NGO** working in the field of environmental conservation and awareness. The **two interns of Sweden** also shared their experience on the topic.
- i) The Planning forum of the college in association with the Forum of Free Enterprise conducted a camp on Leadership Training on 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> August 2018. The

workshop covered wide array of topics like goal setting, understanding one self, effective communication, power of habits and many more.

- j) Self-financing departments had also organized a number of student centric activities. They arranged Seminars by Speakwell Skills Academy, Career Launcher, T.I.M.E. Institute, Arena Animation etc., to create awareness among students of the job-oriented courses.
- k) International Multidisciplinary International conference on 'Climate Change, Environment and Sustainable Development in Global Economy' was organized on 21<sup>st</sup> April 2018. The research articles in the conference were published in an International Multi-disciplinary Referred, U.G.C. approved journal named Naveen Shodh Sansar. (Impact factor = 5.10 (2017) and ISSN: 2320-8767). This was a feather in the cap of S.I.W.S. to have an international research journal of college.

#### II. Co-curricular Activities:

The 72<sup>nd</sup> Independence Day of India was celebrated in college with a great zeal and enthusiasm. The Chief Guest for the function was **Shri. S. Santhanam**, Chairman Emiritus, SIWS Management committee. Various cultural programs with patriotic songs were portrayed by students and teachers of Junior and Degree College.
