#### **Examination Rules**

The present examination system is a Choice Based Credit and Grading System (CBCGS) as per the rules framed by the University of Mumbai from time to time. A learner who successfully completes a course acquires credit points assigned for that course. The Choice based Credit and Grading System was implemented by University of Mumbai as below.

# The Examination and Evaluation pattern: (From 2016-17 till date) For aided programmes (B.Com. and B.Sc.)

- 1. Semester end examination of 100 marks is conducted for each core subject at the end of each term. The duration for theory examination for every course is of 3 Hours. For B.Sc. programmes, a practical examination is also conducted for each core subject at the end of each term.
- 2. For the subject of foundation course, a learner is evaluated on the basis of internal assessment as well as semester end examination. The internal assessment is of 25 Marks (20 Mark project work and 5 mark for active participation and overall conduct) and semester end theory examination is of 75 Marks. Duration of semester end examination in case of foundation course is of 2 hours and 30 minutes.

### For self-financing programmes

- 3. In case of self-financing programmes like (B.A.F. / B.M.S. / B.B.I. / B.A.M.M.C. / B.Sc. C.S / B.Sc. I.T.), the performance of the learners is evaluated in two Components. One component is the Internal Assessment component carrying 25% marks and the second component is the Semester End Examination component carrying 75% marks. The duration of the semester end examination for every course is 2 hours and 30 minutes. The 25 marks of the internal component of every course comprises of a class test of 20 marks and 5 marks for class participation and overall conduct.
  - 4. **Passing Criteria**: 40% (in each component separately where evaluation is for internal and external separate) and 40% for single semester end theory exam.

#### 7. Additional examination:

A candidates who does not appear in F.Y. & S.Y. B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. and self-financed course (Three years integrated) in some or all the courses on medical ground or for representing the College/University in Sports, Cultural activities, N.S.S., N.C.C. or Sports Training camps conducted by the recognized bodies/competent authorities or for any other reason which is considered valid under exceptional circumstances and to the satisfaction of the Principals or Head of the Institutions/Department such candidates are eligible for additional examination.

8. **Gracing Rules**: Grace marks can be allotted to students as per Ordinances 5042A, 5043A, 5044A, 5045A, 5046 and 0.229 A

**ATKT Examination**: The A.T.K.T. examinations are conducted twice a year normally in the month of October and March for all Semester I, II, III and IV. Candidates who have been declared failed at the examination or who have been allowed to keep terms for the higher class shall appear as Ex-student for the respective semester examination held by the college.

**A.T.K.T. rules**: Amended Regulations 8438 & 8439 for all UG programs (aided and non-aided) in Faculties of Arts, Science & Commerce

Eligibility for Admission to all the Under Graduate Programs (aided and non-aided) in the Faculties of Arts and Commerce under Credit Based Semester and Grading System:

Eligibility criteria for a learner, to be admitted in Semester V (Third year) of UG programs (aided and non-aided) in Faculties of Arts and Commerce is amended as follows,

- i) Shall have passed Semester I, II, III and IV in full OR
- ii) Shall have passed Semester I and II in full and secured ATKT in the Second year by failing in not more than Two Courses in each of Semester III and Semester IV OR
- iii) Shall have Secured ATKT in First Year by failing in not more than Two Courses in each of Semester I and Semester II and have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full
- iv) A learner shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester VI irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Semester V. The result of Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, Semester II, Semester III, Semester IV and Semester V in full.

Eligibility for admission to Semester V (Third year) of UG programs (aided and non-aided) in Faculty of Science is amended as follows,

- i) Learner shall have passed Semester I, II, III and IV in full OR
- ii) Learner shall have passed Semester I and Semester II in full and secured ATKT in Second Year by failing in

For programs with 900 and above marks in not more than Three Courses in each of Semester III and IV

For programs with less than 900 marks in not more than Three Courses with not more than total 200 marks in each of Semester III &IV OR

iii) Learner shall have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full and secured ATKT in First Year by failing in,

For programs with 900 and above marks in not more than Three Courses in each of Semester I and II

For programs with less than 900 marks in not more than Three Courses with not more than total 200 marks in each of Semester I & II.

iv) A learner shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester VI irrespective of grades obtained in each course of Semester V. The result of Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, Semester II, Semester III, Semester IV and Semester V in full.
