1. Title of the Practice

2. Objectives of the Practice

To make students socially responsible citizens

To sensitize them to the needs of the disadvantaged sections.

To help them improve their credibility in society.

To enrich them with self-confidence and a sense of accomplishment.

3. The Context

Students were motivated and encouraged to get involved in community service by the faculty. Engaging in such services helps them to improve their character and instil compassion.

4. The Practice

Under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan scheme, students volunteered in cleaning the college premises and also extended their services to cleaning beaches in Mumbai through the NGO Khushiyan foundation. They also added to this social cause by conducting cleanliness survey and increasing awareness about segregation of wet and dry waste.

The students organized and conducted Blood Donation camps in the college, as well as participated in such camps organized by hospitals.

By participating in flood relief campaigns organized by the NGO Khushiyan foundation, students helped flood victims of Konkan region through collection of essential commodities like grains, pulses, packaged foods, toiletries, clothes and blankets.

Making our earth a better place to live by taking care of the environment through activities like tree plantation was another community service taken up by the students. Students participate in such activities within the campus as well as in the neighborhood.

5. Evidence of Success

The volunteers involved in such community services had improved in their interaction with others. They exhibited enhanced team spirit apart from being more compassionate. They were trained to respond to national calamities. The noble act of participating in Blood donation camps helped to sensitize them about the need to contribute to human health and well-being and to the community at large. They learnt that they could contribute to improve the environment by tree plantation.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Initially students were reluctant to participate in such social activities thinking that it would be a waste of time. Through the untiring efforts of faculty, they were convinced and realised how their self-confidence improved through such work.

2. Objectives of the Practice

- > To develop creative skills through a variety of courses.
- > To help students become responsible citizens

3. The Context

Our institution aspires to mold students so as to achieve all round development. Apart from curriculum-based seminars and workshops, we planned to organize value added certificate courses and workshops for our students with the aim of improving their overall progress.

We observed that students were only getting into the mode of rote learning and completing their graduation courses. Interdisciplinary courses will help them expand their horizons and make them think out of the box. They would also start seeing life with better perspective.

4. The Practice

Value added courses conducted in 2021-22 included:

A webinar entitled, "Values: A Compass for Navigating Uncertain Times', which focused on human values.

An Interdisciplinary Online Short-Term Course on 'Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Demystified' which introduced the students to CSR.

An online short-term course on 'Gender sensitization and Social Justice', which emphasised on gender equality.

A Certificate Course on 'Greener Approaches to Environmental Problems' which sensitized students on Environmental issues and advised them to adopt greener approaches in life.

An Online Certificate Course on 'Holistic Development Level-1' which was an introduction course to overall development.

A National Workshop on 'Honing Life Skills for Professional and Personal Success' which helped in Enhancing life skills of students and preparing them for a bright future.

Online Certificate Course on Introduction to Disaster Management which gave an introduction to and a hands-on training on disaster management

5. Evidence of Success

During the courses, students were seen interacting with the resource person, proving that some of them were genuinely interested and were taking benefit from these courses.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Due to the Pandemic situation, the courses had to be conducted online and some students had an issue with network connectivity. Arranging for the appropriate resource people also became challenging for the faculty, since there was no scope of in person contact.
